UPCOMING CA4RJ EVENTS - AN IMPACTFUL APPROACH BASED ON VALUES OF RESTORATIVE JUSTICE AND ARTS FOR THE INCLUSION OF MIGRANTS

After nearly 2 years working in this project partners from the UK, Greece, Cyprus, Türkiye and Spain want to invite workers and professionals working with migrants, cultural and creative professionals, artists, restorative justice practitioners, education staff, social and health services, mental health professionals, community workers, VET and adult education providers, academics, researchers, community organisations, migrants' organisations, campaigners and human rights activists, local, regional and national policymakers, and civil society organisations to showcase the project's results.

The developed model can contribute to the capacity building of workers and cultural and creative professionals working with migrants at risk of being marginalized as well as to the integration of migrants, a group particularly affected by the COVID-19 crisis.

In the UK: 20th of June 2023 in London, The RJ4All Rotherhithe Community Center

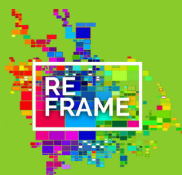
